Little Hands, Big Imagination

05 April 2025 - Saturday

The phrase beautifully captures the idea that even though children may have small physical abilities, their creativity and imagination can be boundless. A child sitting at a small table is coloring or building something with tiny hands. The hands are small, but from them, vibrant and larger-than-life creations are emerging. Tiny, soft hands are literally “giving birth” to a world of ideas, showing that imagination knows no size limits.

Students enthusiastically explored their creativity on the theme “Nature's Beauty,” using paints with great excitement. Guided by their teachers, the young artists proudly showcased their masterpieces, reflecting fine motor skills, attention to detail, and vivid imagination. Colors, Culture and Celebration

Baisakhi

13 April 2025 - Sunday

Students and teachers came together to mark the beginning of the harvest season. Baisakhi, a major harvest festival of North India, especially Punjab and Haryana, is celebrated every year on 13th or 14th April. It marks the ripening of the rabi crop and brings joy and gratitude among farmers for a good harvest.

Baisakhi also holds great religious significance for Sikhs. On this day in 1699, Guru Gobind Singh Ji founded the Khalsa Panth, giving Sikhs a distinct identity based on courage, equality, and selfless service. Baisakhi symbolizes prosperity, unity, and spiritual renewal.

The Panj Piaras were the first five Sikhs to be initiated into the Khalsa brotherhood by Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Sikh Guru, on Baisakhi day in 1699.

A very large gathering of Sikhs had arrived at Anandpur Sahib. After prayers Guru Gobind Singh stood up with his sword and asked the large congregation, "Is there anyone here ready to lay down his life at my call? This sword of mine is crying for the blood of a dear Sikh of mine."

The congregation was shocked and afraid. Guru Gobind Singh repeated his call.

1. **Daya Ram**, a Khatri from Lahore, stood up and offered his head.
2. **Dharam Das**, a Jat from Delhi/Haryana stood up and volunteered at the second call.



Three more offered their heads to the Guru in the same way,

3. **Mohkam Chand**, a washerman of Dwarka, Gujarat.
4. **Himmat Rai**, water carrier from Jagannath (Cuttack)
5. **Sahib Chand**, a barber from Bidar (Mysore).

The Guru called them his Beloved Ones and gave them the last name 'Singh' which means Lion. Guru Gobind Singh then humbly bowed before the Five Beloved Ones and asked them to initiate him into the Khalsa

Brotherhood.

The students mesmerized the audience with traditional Punjabi dances such as Bhangra and Giddha, dressed in colourful attire and brimming with energy. A meaningful skit highlighting the significance of Baisakhi in Sikh culture further enriched the celebration.

The event fostered cultural awareness and unity while celebrating the spirit of joy and gratitude.

Nature, Poetry and Reflection

Remembering William Wordsworth

07 April 2025 - Monday

The World Is Too Much With Us

*The world is too much with us; late and soon,
Getting and spending, we lay waste our powers;
Little we see in Nature that is ours;
We have given our hearts away, a sordid boon!*

The students paid tribute to the great Romantic poet William Wordsworth by remembering him on 07 April the day he was born in 1770 and acknowledging his valuable contributions to English literature.

The event fostered a deep appreciation for Wordsworth's poetry and its enduring connection to nature. Students explored how literature can inspire awareness of the natural world and environmental responsibility.

The poet most widely regarded as the greatest poet of nature in English literature is William Wordsworth.

Wordsworth made nature the central subject of his poetry, not just as scenery but as a living, spiritual force that shapes human emotions, morals, and character. He



believed nature to be a teacher, healer, and guide for the human soul.

Some reasons he holds this title:

- He portrayed nature in its ordinary, real forms—hills, rivers, fields, birds, and rural life.



- He emphasized the spiritual and emotional bond between humans and nature.
- His language was simple and sincere, making nature accessible to common people.

Famous nature poems by Wordsworth include:

- *Tintern Abbey*
- *Daffodils (I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud)*
- *The Prelude*
- *Ode: Intimations of Immortality*

While poets like John Keats (sensuous nature) and P.B. Shelley (dynamic, symbolic nature) also wrote beautifully about nature, Wordsworth remains unmatched in depth, consistency and philosophy of nature.

Inter-House Kho-Kho Competition

Tagore Senior Secondary School hosted an exciting Inter-House Kho-Kho Competition on April 19, 2025. The tournament featured four houses - Bhagat House, Subhash House, Sarojini House, and Kalpana House - and witnessed enthusiastic participation from students.

Bhagat House emerged victorious, displaying excellent skills, teamwork, and coordination.
- **Match 2:** Sarojini House vs Kalpana House
Kalpana House won the second match, showcasing determination and strategic play.

The final match was played between Bhagat House and Kalpana House. Bhagat House secured a remarkable victory, demonstrating exceptional agility and teamwork.



The competition was a grand success, promoting sportsmanship, teamwork, and healthy competition among students. Bhagat House was declared the overall winner, while all participants exhibited great enthusiasm and dedication.

Bhaskara - II (1114 - 1185)

24 April 2025 - Thursday

Mainly remembered for his 1150 AD masterpiece, the *Siddhanta Siromani* (Crown of Treatises) which he wrote at the age of 36. The treatise comprises 1450 verses which have four segments. Each segment focuses on a separate field of astronomy and mathematics. They were :

- **Lilavati**: A treatise on arithmetic, geometry and the solution of indeterminate equations;

- **Bijaganita**: A treatise on Algebra;
- **Goladhyaya**: Mathematics of Spheres;
- **Grahaganita**: Mathematics of the Planets.

Bhaskara-II became the head of the astronomical observatory at Ujjain to join Ujjain, India's "most prestigious mathematical centre" at the time. It was at Ujjain where Bhaskara II would formulate the ideas which would go on to become his legacy. He built up a strong school of mathematical astronomy and can be called a pioneer in understanding the number systems and solving equations.

Tagore Senior Secondary School celebrated Bhaskara Day on April 24, 2025, in honour of the renowned mathematician Bhaskara. The event featured a Mathematics Speed Test, providing students with an opportunity to showcase their numerical skills and logical thinking.

The mathematics speed test witnessed participation from 91 students of classes VI to VIII.

07 May 2025 - Wednesday

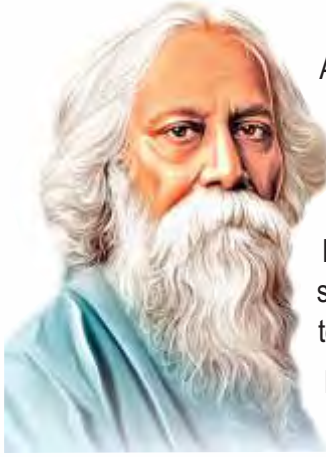

Raksha Bandhan is an ancient Indian festival that celebrates the bond of protection (raksha) and affection (bandhan). Its roots lie not in a single historical event but in a blend of mythology, history, and social tradition that evolved over centuries.

Vedic and Puranic Origins

The idea of a sacred thread symbolising protection appears in early Indian texts.

- In the Vedas, priests tied a protective thread (raksha sutra) during religious rituals.
- In the Bhavishya Purana, Lord Krishna advises King Yudhishtira about a thread tied by Queen Shachi (Indrani) on Indra's wrist to protect him in battle between gods and demons.
- Draupadi tore a strip of her sari to bandage Krishna's finger.
- Krishna vowed to protect her always - fulfilled during the Vastra Haran episode.
- Rani Karnavati of Mewar sent a rakhi to Mughal emperor Humayun seeking protection against Bahadur Shah of Gujarat.
- Humayun accepted the rakhi and came to her aid.
- A celebration of brother-sister relationships
- A social institution strengthening family bonds
- A reminder of duty, responsibility, and mutual respect

Historically, Raksha Bandhan has moved from:

Ritual protection → moral duty → social harmony

It reflects India's ability to transform a simple ritual into a deep civilizational value-protection rooted in love, not power.

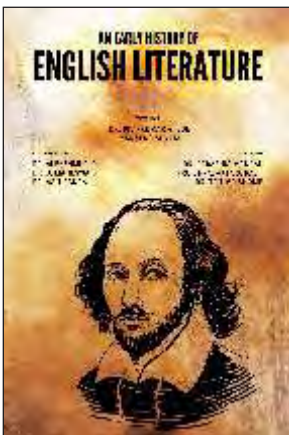

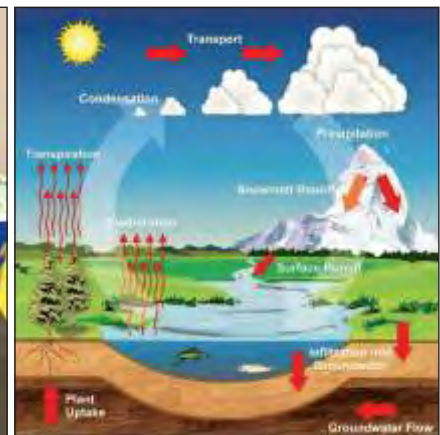

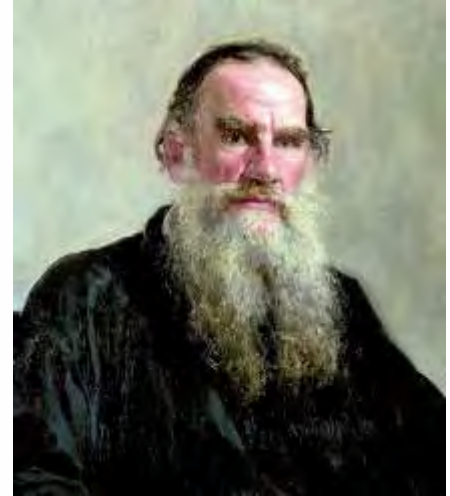

Among the esteemed guests were 52 NCC cadets from Tagore Sr. Sec. School, who were privileged to witness the grandeur of aerial performances up close.

The Sunlit Skies: Suryakiran Team's Aerial Ballet

The highlight of the event was undoubtedly the breathtaking aerobatic display by the Suryakiran Team, a premier aerobatic





team of the Indian Air Force. With precision and finesse, the team executed a series of intricate maneuvers, leaving the audience mesmerized. The sheer skill and coordination of the pilots were on full display, showcasing the team's exceptional training and expertise.

Marking the Skies: Hawk 321's Formation Flying

The air show also featured the Mark Hawk 321 aircraft, which performed an impressive array of formations, demonstrating the capabilities of the Indian Air Force's training fleet. The aircraft's agility and maneuverability were on full display, providing a thrilling experience for the spectators.

Tribute to a Hero: Sahil Gandhi

In a poignant tribute, a flypast was conducted in honor of the brave martyr, Sahil Gandhi. The aerial salute, performed by a formation of fighter jets, was a fitting tribute to his courage and sacrifice. The ceremony served as a reminder of the bravery and dedication of our armed forces personnel.

During 2019, Wg Cdr Sahil was chosen to be part of the team that was tasked to take part in the prestigious air show scheduled to be held in Feb 2019 in Bangalore. Wg Cdr Sahil was known to be among the best fighter pilots of the Indian Air Force and had the experience of flying the Sukhoi-30, Mirage 2000 and MiG 21s before joining the SKAT. He was selected among the best pilots of the Indian Air Force to train on the Hawks in United Kingdom for two years before the aircraft was inducted into the IAF in the mid-2000s. The squadron chalked out the training schedule in detail for the air show and Wg Cdr Sahil trained along with his comrades as per their training schedule for various formations planned for the air show.

On 19 Feb 2019 Wg Cdr Sahil's training task included practicing difficult spin manoeuvres along with his team mates. As the spin manoeuvre was underway, at around 1150 hrs, the two Hawk jets spiralled out of control mid-air, causing a collision. There were three air crew in the two aircraft and all of them undertook emergency measures as per the SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) and ejected. The other two pilots, Wg Cdr Vijay Shelke and Sqd Ldr Tejeshwar Singh got away with minor injuries but Wg Cdr Sahil sustained serious injuries. Wg Cdr Sahil later succumbed to his injuries and was martyred. Wg Cdr Sahil was a dedicated soldier and a competent air warrior who laid down his life in the line of his duty. After the crash, IAF's Surya Kiran aerobatic team flew the first formation paying tribute to Wg Cdr Sahil Gandhi as an incomplete diamond with his place vacant as a tribute to him.

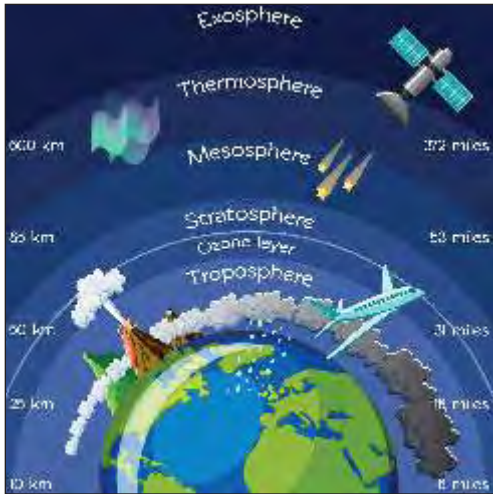
International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer

Birthday Celebration of Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam

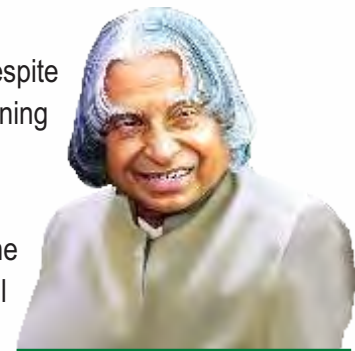
(15 October, 2025 - Sunday)

Authority and visitor of the National University of Study and Research in Law, Ranchi.

- **Human Rights & Reform:** Known for judgments on gender justice and prison reforms, including a directive to create schemes for conjugal visits for inmates.
- **Major Benches:** Involved in significant cases regarding the Abrogation of Article 370, the Pegasus Project revelations, and the suspension of the sedition law.
- **Electoral Bonds:** Served on the initial bench hearing petitions against the constitutionality of the Electoral bonds scheme.

Notable Controversy

India's Got Latent Case: Expressed strong disapproval of remarks made by comedian Ranveer Allahabadi. During the hearing, he criticized "over smart" youth and emphasized that fundamental rights are tied to the fulfillment of "duty".

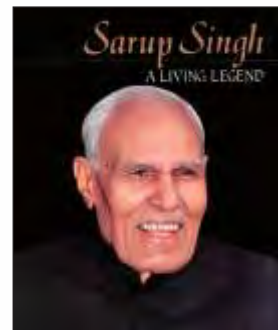
Education

How a Neuron Works?

A neuron is a specialized nerve cell that receives, processes, and transmits information. It has dendrites that receive signals, a cell body that processes them, and a long axon that carries an electrical impulse called an action potential.

When this impulse reaches the axon terminals, the neuron releases chemical messengers called neuro-transmitters into the synapse (the gap between two neurons).

These chemicals then activate the next neuron. A neuron works on the all-or-none principle, meaning it either fires completely or not at all, and the myelin sheath around the axon helps the impulse travel faster.
